MSCA IFs take the form of European Fellowships and Global Fellowships.

An application must be developed jointly by the researcher and supervisor.

1. European Fellowships involve a single host organisation (future beneficiary) established in an EU Member State or Associated Country. The proposal is developed by the researcher together with the supervisor. For European Fellowships the applicants can submit their proposals as a Standard Fellowship to one of the 8 main evaluation panels or to one of the 2 multidisciplinary panels: Career Restart Panel (CAR) and Reintegration Panel (RI). The CAR panel provides financial support to individual researchers who want to resume research in Europe after a career break, while the RI panel is dedicated to researchers who want to return to Europe to reintegrate in a longer term research position.

2. **Global Fellowships** are composed of an outgoing phase during which a researcher spends 1 to 2 years on secondment to a partner organisation in a Third Country, plus a mandatory 12-month return period to a host organisation (the beneficiary) located in a Member State or Associated Country.
